**Speaker Biographies**

**Dr. Anthony S. Fauci, *Director, National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases***

Dr. Fauci, a native of Brooklyn, New York, began his career at the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) in 1968 as a clinical associate in the Laboratory of Clinical Investigation. Dr. Fauci was appointed Chief of the NIAID Laboratory of Immunoregulation in 1980, a position he still holds. Four years later, he became Director of NIAID and oversees an extensive research portfolio of basic and applied research to prevent, diagnose, and treat infectious diseases such as HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted infections, influenza, tuberculosis, malaria, and illness from potential agents of bioterrorism. As Director of NIAID, Dr. Fauci serves as a key advisor to the White House and Department of Health and Human Services on global AIDS issues and other infectious diseases threats. Dr. Fauci received his MD degree from Cornell University Medical College in 1966. He then completed an internship and residency at The New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center.

**Dr. Andrew Kambugu, *Head of Prevention, Care & Treatment at the Infectious Diseases Institute in Kampala, Uganda***

Dr. Kambugu was the pioneer fellow in Infectious Diseases at the IDI in the College of Health Sciences at Makerere University. He heads the PCT program, which serves over 15,500 Ugandans living with HIV/AIDS, including 8,600 on antiretroviral therapy. He also holds an adjunct assistant professor position at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis. Dr. Kambugu is a well-published researcher, with several peer reviewed publications in medical journals. He has supervised four postgraduate students. He serves on two national health committees and has delivered five invited guest lectures at international scientific meetings. He received his medical training in internal medicine at Makerere University in Kampala, Uganda. He received additional training at the University of Utah and University of Manitoba as part of his fellowship training in Infectious Diseases.

**Staffan Landin, *Web Producer, Gapminder Foundation***

Mr. Landin is a communications specialist focusing on global development issues. He obtained a degree in journalism from Mid Sweden University in Sundsvall, Sweden. He then joined the United Nations Development Programme in Copenhagen, working on Human Development and the Human Development Reports. In 2005, Mr. Landin began freelance writing and giving lectures on issues concerning global development and the Millennium Development Goals. During this time, Mr. Landin wrote *Is the World Getting Any Better?*, a book published in Swedish that introduces issues pertaining to international development. In 2007, Mr. Landin joined the internationally-acclaimed Gapminder Foundation.
