11:15 AM JoJo Laali: A Heart Wrenching Lullaby by Sundeep Malani (India, 40 minutes)

A beautiful young woman is wooed by a man who gets her pregnant and then abandons her. She then discovers that she and her young son have AIDS. A story about love, loss and ultimately, empowerment.

12:15 PM Blood of Yingzhou District (China, 39 minutes)

This Academy Award winning film follows a year in the life of children in the remote villages of Anhui Province, China, who have lost their parents to AIDS. Traditional obligations to family and village collide with terror of the disease.

1:30 PM Keep a Child Alive with Alicia Keys (South Africa, 1 hour 06 minutes)

Five young Americans win the chance to travel South Africa with singer Alicia Keys as she visits Keep a Child Alive funded sites in Johannesburg and Durban.

3:15 PM A Motherland Tour: A Journey of African Women with Yvonne Chaka Chaka (Throughout Africa, 52 minutes)

The film interweaves legendary African singer Yvonne Chaka Chaka's music with inspiring stories of women throughout Africa who are making a difference in their communities. It focuses on critical health issues for women and girls, including HIV/AIDS, malaria, lack of access to health care, and maternal and child health.

Followed by a conversation with South African singer and humanitarian Yvonne Chaka Chaka, Accordia Global Health Foundation President Dr. Warner C. Greene, and global expert and advocate Louis Da Gama.
